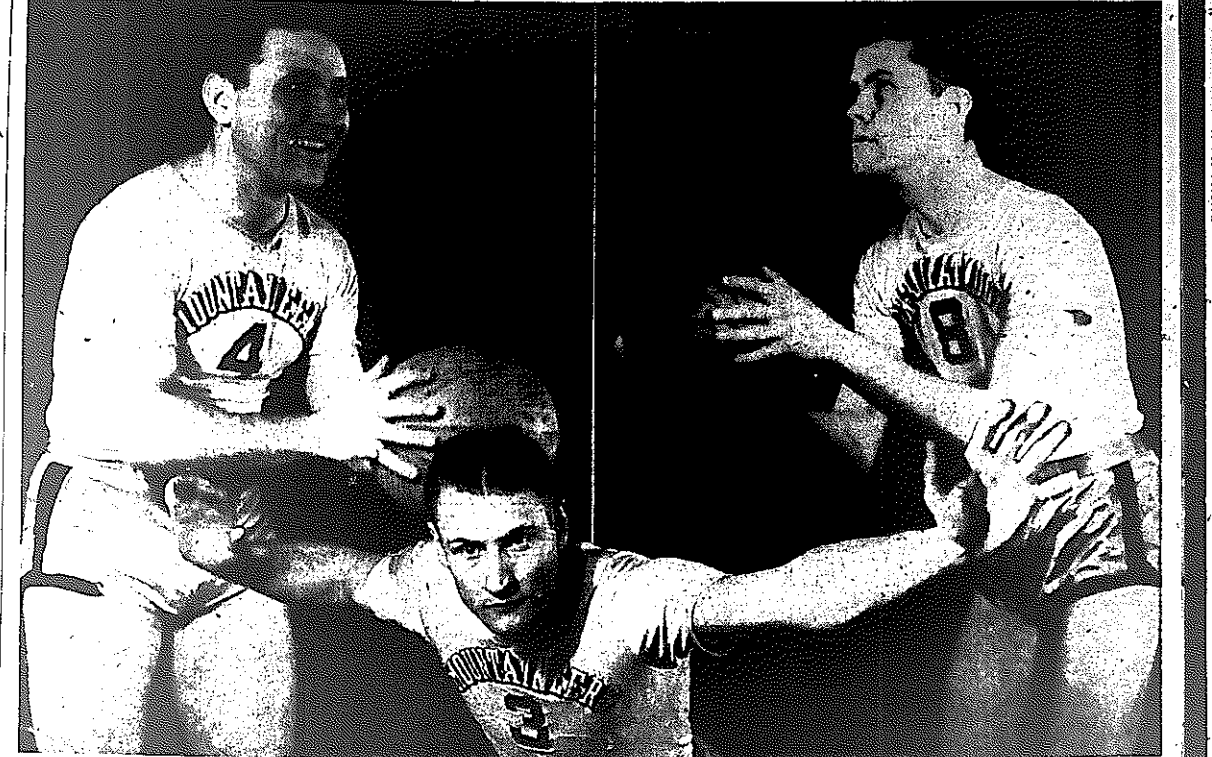

The Soph Deacons looked in a free throw to tie things up and then silent Sammy Roberts led the Colonials to a 30-35 lead. The Deacons, making their varsity basketball debut, made good with a free throw, and Cedric Loftis followed suit to put the game on ice.

The Deacon Deacons surprised everyone except themselves by grabbing a 32 lead over George Washington after four minutes of play and they held a 20-15 margin at halftime. The Deacons opened the second half with another split and took a 30-21 lead. The Colonials decided it was time to get busy and managed to get within four points of the Deacons at the final whistle.
