

# Citadel-VPI Bill Tests City For Conference Meet

## Collegians Come Here January 28

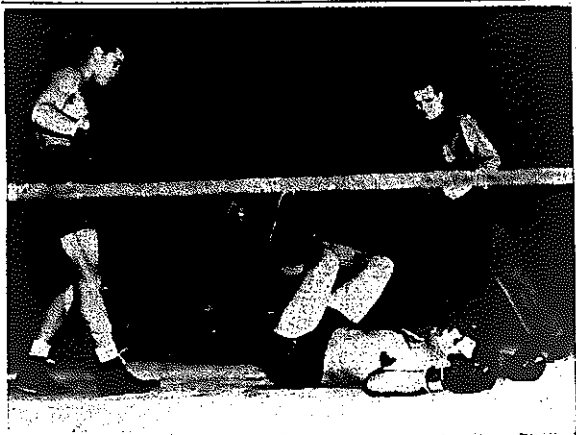
The Citadel and Virginia Tech. will meet here in a basketball doubleheader on Jan. 28. The Citadel's basketball team is coached by Coach J. A. Younger and plans for the city's biggest collegiate sports attraction of a season.

They confessed they expected a crowd to watch the doubleheader, agreed that the landing of a 1942 Southern Conference boxing tournament for Charlotte might open the public reaction to a dual meet.

Citadel's boxing bouts are presently in progress, but will have only one individual king bout for the local card. But the loss suffered through graduation of Coach Captain Dick Rich, and the Cadets from Charleston will be ranked favorites in fighting over the Gobbler.

Virginia Tech finished third in a conference boxing race, but only two members of that team were back. Ken's Belmont, 165; Bob Andrews, 135. Andrews is conference champion in weight.

The doubleheader, first set up for Charlotte's support by outside colleges, will open with the basketball game at 7:30 in the Army. The boxing program, of eight matches will begin at 8:30.

## Louis Passes His Physical For the Army

NEW YORK (AP)—Joe Louis passed his final physical examination today for induction into the Army, and will take the last step Wednesday at Camp Tipton, Long Island, which will charge him to plain Private Joe Louis Barrow.

The heavyweight champion went through an hour and a half physical test at Fort Jay, Governor's Island, along with some 400 other celebrities.



"Well, guess I haven't got these flat feet I was afraid of," Louis said on hearing that the Army physicians had declared him "iron feet."

The Bomber lifted the scales at 220 pounds in the course of the examination, compared with the 206 3/4 at which he weighed in before flattening Buddy Baer in Garden last Friday. The 220 represented Joe and above five pounds of clothing.

In registering he gave his real name as Joe Louis Barrow and when asked for his occupation replied:

BUFFALO, N. Y.—Joe McCarthy is confident that optimistic war conditions has world champion New York Yankees "are going to be tough again."

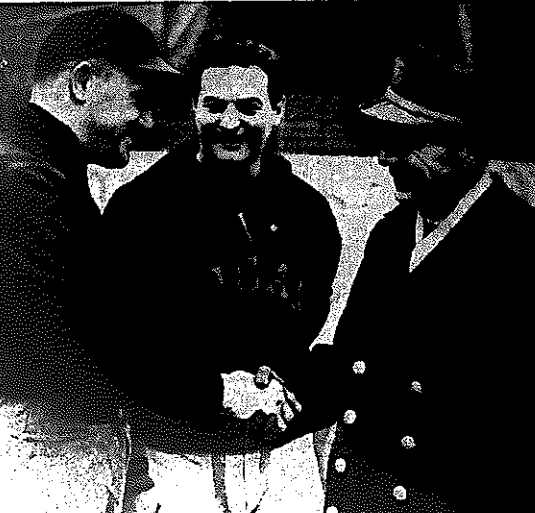
Further, McCarthy is prepared to take the Army and its possible inroads on his playing talent in stride.

It's still in doubt about a first baseman, the Johnny Simon due to report for Army induction next month—but he's far from worried.

The biggest problem in choosing between Ruddy Hascett, recently acquired from the Boston Braves, and Tommy Henrich, who fields the position like a veteran, is a matter of all, though normally an outfielder.

Fitter base also might present a slight problem with Red Hefflinger on the sick list.

"It all depends on Roff's health," McCarthy observed, pointing out that Second Baseman Gregego Rizzo, who came up with Phil Rizzuto from Kansas City last year, could play third if necessary. McCarthy said his third probably would include Rizzuto at shortstop and Joe Gordon at second as right-hand hitter available for relief only.

Among the newcomers McCarthy expects to work out the lineup are pitcher John Lindell, a right-hander who has pitched more than twenty games for Newark last year to lead the International League and Zelig Glass, hard-hitting Newark catcher.

"Bill Rizzuto will do," McCarthy says. Joe DiMaggio, Charles Keller and George Selkirk heading the parade of clouting Yankee outfielders. McCarthy pointed out there are two big problems for the opposition: "We're not hitting or pitching and hitting are going to be real problems for the other clubs."

## Army Camps Football's Best in '42

NEW YORK—George Halas, biggest man in the professional game, says the best football next fall will be played in military camps.

The pro, he points out, will necessarily have to get along with older men.
