WAR WORK IS CONCENTRATED

TAN A FEW PLANTS

Here are some figures that can be used. In the United States are about 180,000 industrial plants, including all of the little one. We are using only a fraction of them. Ninety-tire per cent of the war work is concentrated in 3022 plants. Serenty-tire per cent of it is confined to about 100 manufacturers.

How can we hope to produce what the coming war program will call for on that basis! It will call for ming half our national income instead of 20 per cent as now. We are not even keeping up with the existing program. The Tolan Committee of the House of Representatives says in its report that a. "dangerous discrepancy" exists be-tween the scale of the program which Congress is providing and the actual execution of the work.

Our whole industrial economy must be treated as one gigantic industrial plant. Until there is enough imagina-tion, central planning and directing brains at work to begin treating the whole country as one vast war plant, we will be fighting a total war with partial effort.
