WASHINGTON, (AP)—Secretary of War Stimson, arguing for the draft of eighteen and nineteen year olds, estimated today that the Army now had 4,250,000 men and next year would swell to 7,500,000.

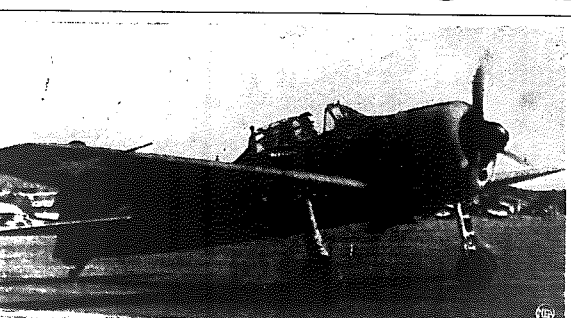
