## American, British Force In Action

LONDON.—(AP).— Driving eastward "as fast as possible, according to plan," a joint American-British force was reported at grips today with Axis troops acknowledged by Berlin and Rome to have been rushed across the Mediterranean to make a fight for France's key North African protectorate.
