WASHINGTON—One week after Pearl Harbor, Wendell Wilkie was invited to lunch with the White House. During his visit Wilkie gave this friendly, frank advice to the President:

"You have come through this (Pearl Harbor) in very good shape. The American people are solid behind you. They realize it wasn't your fault. But the thing you've got to guard against is another mistake. If there should be another great catastrophe the reaction will be different."
