U. S. Cruiser Limping Home From Indies

Hit Anew at Jap Bases

Seek To Paralyze Jap Offensive Punch ALLIED HEADQUARTERS. Australia. — (AP) — Allied bombers smashed anew yesterday at Japanese bases above Australia in the steady effort to keep the enemy from building up new strength. Allied Headquarters announced today, with attacks on Lae, New Guinea, and Rabaul, New Britain. Lae, where the raid was the sixth in ten days, was the target of heavy attacks. The attack on Rabaul was the third in four days but headquarters said that "this was observed in the target area."

Hull Promises Reply To Vichy's Rejection Of American Note

WASHINGTON. — (AP) — Secretary of State Hull said today that Vichy's rejection of an American note backing up the British coup on Madagascar called for a reply. Hull was asked whether the Government considered French resistance to the British on Madagascar as a warlike act within the meaning of the American note handed to the French Ambassador Monday night.

Auto Bill Approved

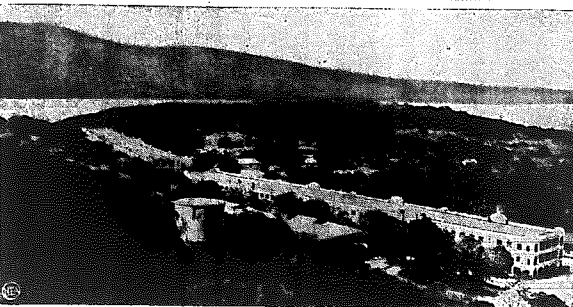
