WASHINGTON
POST office officials have been checking into the thousands of postage-free letters which Congressman James Morrison has been scattering over Louisiana, to see whether he has violated the franking privilege. Morrison, nicknamed the "synthetic Huey Long" is running for Governor of Louisiana and, despite the state with about a quarter of a million letters—all of them free.

The letters contain an appeal by Morrison for support in his bid for Governor. The appeal has no subterfuge about it. "I am writing you this letter," says the would-be Governor "of Louisiana, to ask for your vote and your support in the coming Governor's election." This appeal for votes, taken by itself, would be in violation of postal laws when sent under a Congressman's franking privilege. However, the gentleman from Louisiana very cleverly inserted in the same envelope an excerpt from the Congressional Record containing one of his speeches entitled "Our War Heroes Deserve the Best."
