Russians Less Than 40 Miles From City Other Points Also Menaced

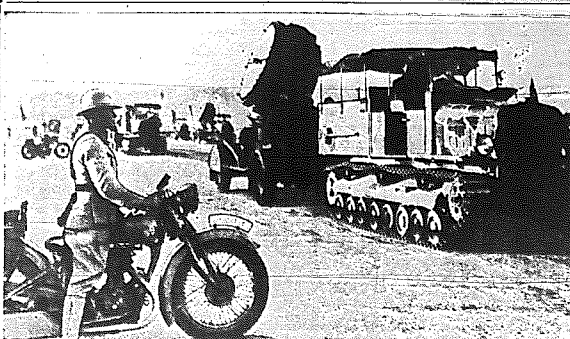

Favors Withholding Levy; Opposes Ruml Plan To Forgive 1942 Levies WASHINGTON — (AP) — Enactment of pay-as-you-go tax legislation to provide a 19 per cent withholding tax after deductions for millions of America's income taxpayers was urged today by the Treasury. It flatly opposed the Ruml plan to skip one year of tax liability to make income payments current.

New Order Lists Many Jobs Not Essential

Must Find War Work or Go WASHINGTON — (AP) — Thousands of Selective Service registrants having deferments were given a 60-day notice today to find essential war jobs or else get ready to shoulder a rifle as Congressional committees broaden their study of the manpower problem.

It was announced today.

Declares Promise To Strike Hard In Europe To Be Fulfilled WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Roosevelt said today his Casablanca conference with Winston Churchill was one to win the war and to fulfill the promise he made in his annual message to Congress that the United Nations would strike hard in Europe.

British & Turk Leaders Confer

Churchill Agrees With Turkish President on Plans for Bolstering Defenses LONDON — (AP) — Prime Minister Churchill, carrying forward the Allied pattern for conquest of the Axis designed at Casablanca, has flown to Turkey at the very edge of Hitler's troubled European domain and agreed with President Ismet Inoué, among other things, on plans for bolstering Turkish defenses. It was announced officially today.

Brazil Stop

There were two headlines, Mr. Roosevelt said, his stop on the Brazils being to talk with President Vargas of Brazil. One, he explained, is the greatly increased effort to make the Atlantic a combat zone. The second, he said, is an agreement that the peace of the Atlantic will be a future threat from the African coast to the position of this hemisphere being almost to Africa.

Military Mission

Their journey, Mr. Roosevelt said, the Casablanca conference military mission at Casablanca, he said, was drafted for winning the war when it was possible—and in this case they covered the calendar year 1943. At that point he read a paragraph from his message to Congress, the paragraph which he said was the substance of the conference.

Secret Service Men Used Old Trick to Divert Notice From FR
