If any good can come out of such tracedies as the fall of the Philipplines and Malaya, it is the increasing know-redge that the United States need never again feel totally dependent upon the Far East for essential products. Many commodities (rubber, quinine, acao and other essential materials) which formerly came from remote and alten quarters, can eventually be raised in near-by Middle América, and there are many present day crops, like the nutritious banana, now serving us.

79 per cent of the rubber used by the
world. During 1941 about 800,000 tons
of this rubber were imported by the
U.S. from Far Eastern points now
off from us by the Japanese. When in
vestigations were made, the original
source of Hevea rubber "as found in
South America! In 1875 an English

Boath America! In 1875 an English South America! In 1876 an English botanist, Sir Henry Wickham, shipped to London several backets of wild Hevea seed which had been collected in Brazil. From these seedlings, which were then sent to botanic gardens in the British East, grew the tremendous rubber Industry of the Eastern tropics.

Now the process is being reversed and selected Heven strains are being Now the process is being reversed and selected Heves atrains are being used for experimental rubber plantings in Middle America. These high-yielding strains can produce an average of 1,200 to 1,000 pounds per acre of crude rubber yearly, as compared to a yield of about 300 pounds per acre from the wild seedlings sent to England by Sir Henry in 1876. The United Fruit Co, which has recently established plantings of Heves in Central America, planting to pass along the knowledge gained from experimental plantings to ellipten farmers of Middle America, in the hopes that eventually our own tropics will become the major source of rubber for all the Americas—for war or peace.
