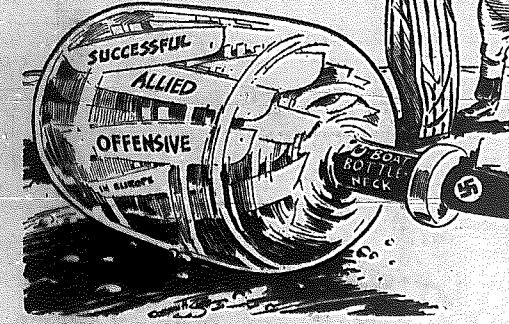

1. Isolation finds, increasingly, that it can do business with Mr. Roosevelt.

2. Isolation, pure and simple, is no longer an issue in American public life. The biggest outstanding issue of American foreign policy is Russia.

3. Isolation is no longer opposed to collaboration, per se. It applauded collaboration with Darlan. It would not object to a treaty with Franco...
