DIVISION REPORTED CAPTURED

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN NORTH AFRICA—
(AP)—Allied forces pushed the enemy into a steadily contracting area in the northern tip of Tunisia, gaining new ground north of Sousse and Kairouan, on the southern side of the Axis box, and in the Medjez-El-Bab sector on the northwest, Allied Headquarters announced today.

(The Algiers radio, in a broadcast recorded in London, said the British Eighth Army had occupied Enflaville, 27 miles north of Sousse and 50 miles south of Tunis. An earlier broadcast said nearly the whole of the Italian Vittoria division had been captured.

(London military quarters ceitimeted that Marshal Erwin Rommel was with drawing into his Tunis-Bizerte defenses, an area about 100 miles long by 60 miles wide, with only about 200,000 men, 150,000 of them Germans.
