ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN NORTH AFRICA—
(AP)—The British Eighth Army in Sicily advanced to within sight of the Italian mainland while British warships bombarded Italian shipyards in the Bay of Naples, 130 miles south of Rome, and other mainland milliary targets, Allied Headquarters announced today.

British forces advanced seven miles along the east coast of Sicily under the shadow of Mt. Etna to capture the town of Guardia, sixteen miles south of Tormina and 40 miles from Messina, the bulletin announced. British Tommics on the east slopes of Mt. Etna thus gained their first view of the Italian mainland.
