LONDON —(AP)—The Eighth American Air Force sent the greatest number of heavy bombers in its history—well over 800—in a thunderous assault against industrial Frankfurt today even as Berlin amoked and burned anew from last night's second heavy RAF blow in a row.

Fighter escorts probably numbering several hundreds accompanied and assisted the Liberators and Flying Fortesses in the blow at the highly-industrialized Germin City. Losses were not announced immediately.

Swedish reports said the complete evacuation of burning Berlin was contemplated, and the Nazis classped a tight censorship on details of the second successive devastating RAF blow to mop up the rubble-strewn capital.
