High Tide

Petrillo's Victory Is Labor's Biggest Victory

Mr. James Caesar Petrillo (not to be confused with Caesar Petrillo, his brother) is by his own admission the most powerful union leader this country has ever seen. He got that way because there was no law to stop him and because his 135,000 members of the American Federation of Musicians have finally forced the big record companies to give in—and pay royalties on every record produced. He was not overrating his triumph when he said:

"This is the greatest victory for labor organization in the history of the world. It is the first time that the American Federation of Musicians is the first labor organization to receive agreements whereby employers pay money directly to the labor organization for the employment of musicians, over and above what they pay for the actual work done by the musicians in the making of recordings."

There is another way to describe J. Caesar's victory, and his victims were quick to mention it. Columbia Recording, one of the major companies compelled at last to pay royalties, said that it did so because of the Government's unwillingness to prosecute for its refusal to obey its orders. It added that "economic pressures on us are such that we can wait no longer and must now either sign or go out of business."

The story, in review, is this: In August, 1942, Petrillo demanded that all recording companies pay him direct royalties of a quarter of a cent to five cents on every record sold. Most of them refused. He slapped on his ban; those companies which would not pay royalties could not have the use of his musicians. The War Labor Board heard the case and after a good deal of debate, certified it to the President. The President asked Economic Stabilization Director Vinson to check. The Judge ruled that the Government could not revoke the ban, as it did not concern war industry. The President then pleaded with Petrillo, got a flat refusal. It then ceased to be a contest.

With the Government counted out, it was a battle of man strength between the recording companies and Mr. Petrillo, hands down. He finds reason enough to examine the old age insurance program. By the first of the year, he estimates, there will be something over a billion dollars in that reserve fund. That is twelve times the lowest and eight times the highest estimate of benefits which must be paid out in any one of the next five years. In short, we have accumulated funds at a much higher rate than the original act anticipated—and disbursements have been much heavier than anticipated. There is considerable evidence to support that point of view, although it is the kind of question you can never answer positively and finally.

One thing is certain. Without President Roosevelt, war or no war, the Democrats wouldn't have had a shot of a chance. It was his policy and his personality that made a narrow margin of victory possible. At his press conference Friday, the President was asked that inevitable question. Would he be a candidate again in 1948? He turned it off jokingly.

Lame Ducks Waddle In At Just The Wrong Time

Beginning today, the Twentieth Amendment is in force for a period of "transition." The amendment, favored by fighting old George Norris, was to end the undesirable lame-duck system. By moving forward the opening of a new Congress two months, from March to January 3, Congressmen who had been re-elected by the voters would not be allowed a second year of office without the voters' approval. It was the law which brought frustration to the scheme, under a most unfortunate set of circumstances.

For Congress merely recessed in September, and opens its final session today. In its seats will perch some 70 lame-duck Representatives and about a dozen lame-duck Senators. Among them are many men who are not ordinary lame ducks. These men are isolationists, some of them unrepentant and unrepenting. They have been repudiated almost savagely by the electorate, which believes their presence in Washington to be dangerous to the future of the country and the world we hope to build.
