Attack May Be Herald Of Amphibious Operations In Far East Area

SOUTHEAST ASIA HEADQUARTERS, KANDY, Ceylon—(AP)—Striking a blow that may be the forerunner of amphibious operations, a powerful Allied air-sea force of carriers, battleships and other warships hit out at the Japanese base of Sabang and an airfield at the Northern tip of Sumatra at dawn yesterday.

An earlier carrier-borne air attack on a small scale was made on Sabang in December, 1942. Allied bombers and fighters took off from the carriers somewhere in the Indian Ocean and carried out a surprise raid on Sabang and Lhonga airfields in Northern Sumatra.
