Nazi Big Gun Fire Sweeping Approaches

On Move To The West, However By WES GALLAGHER SUPREME HEADQUARTERS ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE (AP) American infantrymen, closed in their attack on St. Lo, hurrowed into the ground and held resolutely to their positions two miles outside that highway center of the Normandy peninsula today in the face of the American artillery fire sweeping the approaches.

To the west, however, the American Army was on the move from St. Lo to the sea, with infantry and tanks only one and one-half miles from the German western armor at Lesnoz, and Supreme Headquarters said the Germans were apparently were making a "orderly withdrawal."
