Purge Stamps Out Attempted Coup D'etat

Fuehrer Makes Bid To Keep German Army Behind Him

LONDON.—(AP)—Adolf Hitler asserted in an order of the day to German troops today that an attempted coup d'etat by "a small circle of unscrupulous officers" had been crushed, and expressed confidence the army "will fight with exemplary obedience and loyalty until victory is ours in spite of all."

Guam Liberation Ahead Of Schedule

U. S. PACIFIC FLEET HEADQUARTERS, Pearl Harbor.—(AP)—The liberation of Guam—avenging the tiny American garrison overrun by Japanese forces in December, 1941—was pushed ahead of schedule today by steadily reinforced Yanks swarming in from the north.

Sentenced In Treason Case

CHICAGO.—(AP)—Saved by an Appellate Court decision from death in the electric chair, Otto Rupp and Walter Wagner, two German spies who pleaded guilty to charges of espionage in Germany and were returned to this country last year, were sentenced today to life imprisonment and fined \$10,000.

Reds In Supreme Bid For Warsaw
