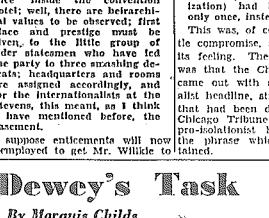

Four Injured When Ferry Boat Crashes

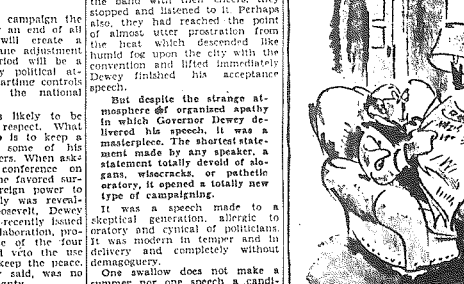
