If there is any truth in the published reports of the New York Herald Tribune and the New York Past, there is every reason to get to the bottom of this matter quickly.

If the situation is as it is thus pictured it is, of course, impossible. There is the well-founded theory that one of the vital services in time of war is complete reporting of news (within security limits) to the home population. If that theory is to building another, then public relations officers themselves have no just reason for being.

The stories have the ring of truth, but it is to be hoped that they are either proven to be in error—or that the misuse of PRO authority will come to a sudden end.
