Mr. Roosevelt called for total mobilization of all our human resources to smash the Axis, and repeated the Allied demand for unconditional surrender of the armies of our enemies.
The President told Congress that total mobilization at home means a national service act now and postwar universal military training.
Mr. Roosevelt will go on the air tonight at 10 P. M. Eastern War Time, over all networks to give the nation his own summary of his annual message.
