Seventh Army Moves Near Bavarian City

PARIS (AP)—The American Seventh Army closed today within 25 miles of Munich and broadcasts from that Nazi citadel said a revolt was seething in the city.

French Balk Allied Drive

PARIS (AP)—A Supreme Headquarters statement today declared the French First Army was obstructing the Allies drive south against the Nazi redoubt by its persistence in continuing to occupy Stuttgart.

Russia Excluded

ROME (AP)—Allied troops captured Bergamo—30 miles from the Swiss border and 125 from the Brenner Pass—and Brescia 30 miles southeast of Bergamo today, Allied Headquarters announced.

Armies May Be Shifted

PARIS (AP)—The historic junction of Austrian and Russian forces in Germany left at least three armies temporarily out of jobs today but there still was much fighting to be done before the war in Europe could be considered over.
