

Church Body To Meet

MONTEAT — (AP) — The 86th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States will be held May 24-30. Approximately 450 persons from 88 churches in 150 Southern States are expected to attend.

The Rev. Charles L. King, D. D., Houston, Texas, moderator, will preside at the opening session. Proposals to come before the assembly at this session include a request that the denomination withdraw from the Federal Council of Churches; eleven Presbyterians will ask discontinuance of efforts to unite the Southern and Northern Presbyterian Churches; and the Moral and Social Welfare Committee will ask a new dispensation on dancing, condemning only overindulgence and lascivious dancing.

The foreign mission committee will call for 100 new missionaries and will report that half the million-dollar recuperation fund has been raised.

A banquet for ruling elders will be held Friday night when Judge John A. Sibley of Atlanta, Ga., will speak on "The Church's Contribution in the Peace of the World."

Claim FEPC Move Balked

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Southern Democrats claimed today to have blocked a move for early creation of a Permanent Fair Employment Practices Commission.

They told a reporter that: 1. A majority of the House Rules Committee has refused to approve legislation to establish a permanent FEPC, thus denying it a place on the House calendar.

2. A move by Chairman Norton, Democrat, New Jersey, of the House Labor Committee to force floor consideration of the measure by means of a discharge petition has bogged down.

3. The Senate Labor Committee has not approved the legislation, and even if it should, Southern Senators have promised to filibuster it to death in that chamber.

The bill would set up a seven-member FEPC with authority to prevent discrimination among potential job holders because of race, color or creed. The present FEPC is a temporary wartime agency operating with executive department funds.

Mrs. Norton's petition would discharge the rules committee of further action on the bill for the measure and send it to the floor for immediate debate.

It requires 218 signatures, however, and Representative Cox, Democrat, Georgia, said "less than 100" have signed it although he said he has signed it for himself.

Mrs. Norton acknowledged that she was "discouraged" by reasons to date, but said she still is hopeful of obtaining enough signatures. Her committee approach to the bill several weeks ago, fearing it necessary to insure returning war veterans and justice in job hunting. Opponents have claimed it would incite ill feeling and promote racial discord, particularly in the South.

Truman Honors Hero Says U. S. To Strike Japan Mighty Blows

WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Truman told Congress today that American forces were preparing to overwhelm the Japanese with "overwhelming power."

Speaking at ceremonies at which he awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor to T. Sgt. Jack Lindsey of Lucrede, Miss.

"This is a proud and moving occasion for every American. It follows the complete victory of the Allied forces over a powerful enemy in Europe. It finds us striking devastating blows in the Pacific. We are preparing to strike them later in overwhelming force."

"Before the battle against Japan is won, we shall have other men to honor—men whose deeds, whom we celebrate today, will have brought closer our inevitable victory."

Lindsey is the 100th infantryman to receive the nation's highest award in battle and the President, in making the presentation personally before a joint session of Congress, set a precedent for such ceremonies.

Through him Lindsey was present to honor a nation's tribute to the courage of all our fighting men," the President said.

"The history of this war is filled with countless acts of valor by our soldiers and sailors and Marines and our air force."

NOT SO ORDERED — The President pointed out that no officer ordered Lindsey, when surrounded, "to engage eight German tanks in hand to hand combat."

"Those decisions came from his own heart," the President asserted. "They were a flash of the nobility which we like to think is a part of every American. They were the unselfish valor which can triumph over terrible odds. They were the very essence of victory."
