Among the assortment of finds in Berlin was one which will be of immense inherest to Allied until any staffs and historians as well. In the home of a General Hermanu Reinecke, described as prepaganda elilel for the German army, the British came across a record of casualities from the start of the war until November 30, 1944. The British consider the figures reliable.

Germany at that time was in about the same fix as in November 1918; she was licked and knew it.
