Army Discharge System

It Still Takes 85 Points To Get Out

WASHINGTON—(AP)—The Army announced today the present point score for discharge will be left at 85 while about 800,000 men with that score are being released.

Latest the score will be revised to provide for the discharge of another 700,000 men by June 1, 1946, the date by which the Army had announced a total of 1,500,000 men would be discharged under the credit point system.

The world was expected to know soon what President Truman, Prime Minister Attlee and Premier Stalin planned for the immediate future of Europe, but the full import of what they accomplished since the sessions opened July 7 may not be realized for some time insofar as decisions may affect the Pacific war.
