The Labor Situation

Government Seeks To Avert Oil Strike

The Government sought today to avert a nation-wide strike of oil workers which would push the nation's total of workers idle over labor disputes well past the 2,000,000 mark.

Edgar L. Warren, new chief of the U. S. Conciliation Service, invited the deadlocked delegates attending the oil strike conference in Chicago to adjourn immediately to Washington "at their request," he said, of Labor Secretary Schweinhaut. Warren said "it was felt" more progress toward a settlement could be made in Washington.

Meanwhile, a walkout of elevator operators in Manhattan, keeping about 100,000 men from their jobs, spread to 100 additional structures today after two locals of the CIO Elevator Operators and Union called a strike over the WLB ruling increasing wages but reducing "take-home" pay. Both sides remained in a WLB hearing to explain why the walkout should not end.

The overall labor picture was the worst in months. The strike last, below the 100,000 mark most recently, has been continuing day by day, bulging as hundreds of thousands of workers were forced off their jobs by disputes, some of them fresh outbreaks.

In the country in the Pacific Northwest where more than 60,000 AFL lumber workers are striking, a CIO union continued policy meeting but delayed a vote to start a strike until Oct. 4.

The White House said Zhukov, who represents Russia on the Allied Council governing Germany, will arrive by air in New York City Oct. 4.

Arrangements for his visit are being handled by the War Department. He will call on the President while here, but the date has not yet been fixed. No other details were announced.

Additional coal miners left their jobs in West Virginia and Pennsylvania during the total miners strike, the two states having more than 35,000. The strike, begun in Pennsylvania alone, mounted to around 70,000 miners, 32,000 at our Washington office. Bituminous plants, fifty-eight bituminous pits were closed.

Elsewhere across the country in metropolitan areas and in smaller communities, workers held the attention of union and management.

DETROIT SITUATION

In Detroit, plagued for months by strikes and shutdowns, and currently employing 30,000 in CIO-United Automobile Workers representatives and Chrysler Corporation executives made arrangements as they received their conference on the union's demand for a 30 per cent wage increase for all workers in the industry.

One dispute in Detroit ended, 2,100 Murray Corp. workers going back to work after being idle for more than two weeks. The majority of them were in the Detroit area from whom the Detroit CIO-UAW officials renewed efforts to end the 35-day strike at the Goodyear Wheel Co., the shop of the Ford Motor Co. plants, filling more than 30,000.
