Monarchy Is 200 Hurt As Blaze Rages Through Hotel

Many Suffocated In Their Beds As Mysterious Flash Fire Sweeps La Salle

CHICAGO — (AP) — At least 58 persons were killed today in an early morning fire that rushed through the La Salle Hotel, in the Chicago Loop district.

Many suffocated in bed without wankening and many were asphyxiated by smoke not phallways, and others were the victims of their own panic which caused them to app from high windows.

o from high windows.

At least 200 persons, among the 1,100 patrons in the 22-story hotel, were injured, e seriously. Many needed only first aid treatment by the Red Cross, after they fled scantily-clad, from the smoke-filled hostelry.

The first alarm was sounded at 12:35 A. M. (CDT). Within ten minutes the first re floors were engulfed in flames and both of the Main Street exits from the 37-rold hostelry were impassable.

Five extra alarms were sounded and more than 300 firemen battled the blaze bringit under control about 3:30 A. M.

Most of those who were burned had been housed on the third, fourth, fifth and sixth

Most of those who were burned had been housed on the third, fourth, fifth and sixth s. About the sixth floor, smoke and panic claimed their victims. At least ten perdied as they leaped from their rooms and fell to the street or in a courtway.

Of the 5s bodies that overflowed the County Morgue or were held in a hospital and a mortuary, 22 were unidentified. On many of the bodies there were only a few fragments of burned clothing, which crumbled when touched. Most were clad only in fregligees or robes.
