## Truman Assails 'Organized Mistrust' Among Nations

### Says Unity Needed For Economic Recovery

Scores 'Folly' Of Nationalism

CHARLOTTEVILLE, Va. —(AP)—President Truman today described as "European" the refusal of any foreign nation to take part in a co-operative plan for the continent's economic recovery.

Without mentioning the Soviet Union by name, Mr. Truman struck out at the "organized mistrust" he said leads the world's people away from peace and unity.

He called for an end of "propaganda attacks upon other nations."

Mr. Truman said he is "living up to its responsibilities for creating the economic conditions of peace."

Yet, certain nations today are withholding their support of reconstruction plans on the ground that this would mean interdependence with some nations in the international affairs.

He said that it would involve interdependence in his private affairs.

Mr. Truman said that the world nations should have learned the folly of a nationalism so extreme as to block co-operative economic planning among nations for peaceful reconstruction.

## Will Go To Paris Greeks And Danes Accept Parley Bids

Greece and Denmark announced today they would take part in the European economic consultations projected by Britain and France under the Marshall proposal.

Premier Knud Kristensen of Denmark told his nation's intention in a speech to thousands of Danish-Americans celebrating July 4 in the rebuilt National Park in Jutland. He termed the preparations initiated under the Marshall proposal "a peaceful offensive."
