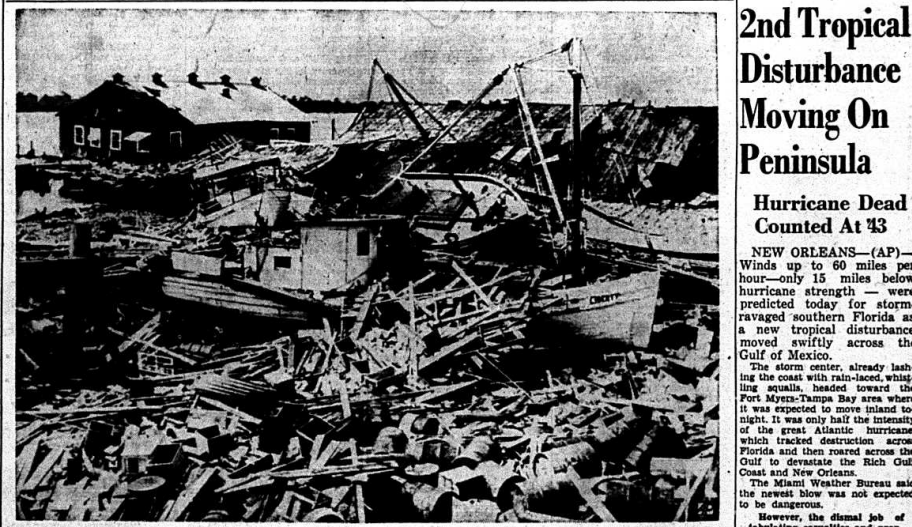

NEW YORK—(AP)—Herbert Hoover said last night that the 1947 world harvest may yield as little as that of 1945 and he outlined steps needed "if large areas of the world are to be saved from mass starvation."

Warns Peace Is Menaced By Soviet Attitude

NEW YORK — (AP) — Britain warned today that if the Soviet Union persisted in trying to force its own will upon the world, the unstable peace of the world will crumble and crash "with hideous consequences."
