Back To Normalcy And Isolation

WITH THE opening today of the 80th
Congress in second regular session,
we are going to get another Taft Plan. It
will be the Republican Senate leader's substitute for the Marshall Plan for European stitute for the Marshall Plan for European recovery and it will have the same New Look or odd look we find in the Taft Plan for inflation control, which was enacted at the recent special session as the Republi-can substitute for the 10-point Truman program.

Both Taft Plans are the easence of simplicity, the point being that we will get neither inflation control nor European recovery with the machinery devised or projected by the Ragubiletan policymaker. More Inflation As A 'Cure'

THAT OLD inflationist, Senator Elmer Thomas of Oklahoma, Democrat, may be said to have settled the argument over what to do about inflation—or rather what will be done about it.

What we need is not less but more infla-tion, says the Senator, and that obviously is what we are getting. Prices "must go even higher" to assure a stable economy,

he declares.

"Teel that in my State of Oklahoma, for example, the majority of people would suffer anything at this time rather than go back to price control and rationing." he back to price control and rationing the people who are made glidy by the profits they are colling on the price spiral. It doesn't seem likely that he has consulted with hospital officials and health authorities toget the latest figures on the increase in mainutrition among children of low-income families who know there are worse things thap price control and rationing.

In this, the Oklahoma Senator is no more callous to the plight of consumers who are carrying the burden of high prices, and no more devoted to the interests of the profitmore devoted to the interests of the profit-makers than are the majority of our law-makers in Washington. His statement has the merit of a candid confession that the opposition to price regulation comes from a desire to prolong the boors and not rore an honest conviction that price controls will now twork.

Our politicians and the National Asso-dation of Manufacturers have exhausted the argument that it is useless to experi-nent with measures of the OPA type, con-ending that such curbs merely attack the

symptoms and not the causes of inflation.
Everyone knows the inflation has its roots in maladjustment of supply and demand and that the emergency will not be passed until increased production restores the balance, or a deflation cuts the money supply. Inflation has passed beyond any chance of control when our eminent statesmen begin telling us the 'emedy lies in another spurt in the price jag.
