North Carolina's Titanium

IT 18 perhaps too early to attempt an evaluation of the ultimate effect on the economy of North Carolina of titanium, a metal which until some few years ago was considered little more than an impurity in other metals but which is now being mined and processed (on a small scale) in this state.

The development of titanium — a silver-white, light, strong metal — has been undertaken seriously only recently. It is possible that difficulties may crep up in its industrial application, But, it is also possible that this metal which is comparable to attainless steel in strength and corrosion resistance but which weight only a little more than half as much may become one of the most important, most used metals in the near future. In the latter case, North Carolina industry and capital should be slert now, ready — if demand and further improvements warrant mass production— of sep into the

We must be ready, too. to welcome Northern capital in the development of titanjum, to welcome processing mills and mining companies. E. I. du Pont de Nemours and Company, Inc., is already showing considerable interest in the new basic raw material. A pilot unit producing 100 pounds of titanium daily is in operation at that company's Newport, Del., plant of its Pigments Department.
