Greeks To Attack Sub

ATHENS—(AP)—The Greek Navy Ministry today ordered its warships to attack and sink the Greek-registered submarine in Greek territorial waters.

The order followed the reported sinking of two strange submarines.

One was reported between the Peloponnese and Crete, and another off the coast of Preveza, in the Ionian Sea.

Troop and supply ships now are being escorted by destroyers and corvettes equipped with depth charges.

WASHINGTON — (AP) — A bill to extend rent controls fourteen months in greatly relaxed form threatened to bring on an action year free-for-all in Congress today.
