of parental responsibility has been uncovered in a four-year study of criminals and

words, it is not, so much parents' neglect of
children, or failure to teach them proper
behavior, but rather home bickering and
nagging that sets boys and girls on the
wrong track.

Even home tension of a subtle nature is felt by children, says Dr. Abrahamsen. Their response to such a home life is resentment, hostility, and rebellion against authority, which often lead, not only, to criminality, but to physical and mental diseases. Most of the criminal offenders examined in the study had psychocomatic named in the study had psychocomatic liness, as did a high proportion of the 200

members of their families investigated.

This study is of special significance in that it shifts the emphasis in assessing crine causes from economic and social to emotional background. Weak, domineering, quarreling or emotionally infantile parents who create home tensions that encourage anti-social behavior in their offspring may be found in any walk of life. And they will not be cured by being lectured or even put in jail. Here again we come back to the problem that is looming larger and larger in man's search for peace and order in the world, as well as his home and personal life, it is that of developing more emotionally matter human beings, especially though who have anything to do with children.
