Minnesota Guard Is Called Out In Strike Violence

Mob Raids Meat Plant, Abducts 30 As Hostages

ST. PAUL, Minn. — (AP) — The Minnesota National Guard was called out today for duty at strikebound packing plants in Newport and South St. Paul, scenes of strike violence.

Governor Luther Youngdahl directed the Adjutant General to call the troops after a mob raided the Cudahy plant in Newport last night, damaging the interior and carrying away 30 plant workers as hostages.

Yesterday South St. Paul police were alerted to enforce a court order prohibiting mass picketing.

Adjutant General Elmer Walsh said a "substantial task force" of the guard would get the strike argument, if the indicated mobes and mechanized units would be used in the town.

NO MARTIAL LAW
The Governor said he was not prepared to enforce martial law but was calling for a show of force to quell strike violence.
