The Security Council induced Bussia to withdraw troops from Iran and had almost as great influence in withdrawal of British and French troops from Syria and Lebanon. It helped protect Greece's integrity despite three Russian vetoes. It obtained a truce between the Dutch and Indonesia. The India-Pakistan violence would undoubtedly have been much worse without UN. A plebiscite was arranged in Korea. Russia vetoed blaming Albania for mine damages to British destroyers and loss of 4 lives in Korfu Channel, but the case went to the International Court and both parties recognized the court's jurisdiction. went to the International Court and both parties recognized the court's jurisdiction. The court is considering validity of Russian vetoes of memberships. If Russia vetoes findings on Czechoslovakia it must do so in face of the record of evidence. Thus, as a single veto in the Security Council gets more public attention than an entire session of the Trusteeship Council or the Economic and Social Council, many of us may have been too prone to glare from a wide-open, bloodshot and skeptical eye at UN fallures while squinting from a weaker eye at its accomplishments.
