Russian Propaganda Is Juvenile

SECRETARY OF STATE MARSHALL is no fool. He, as well as almost every other thinking person in the world, recog-nizes that Russian propaganda is a com-pound of falsehood, distortion, deliberate specification of dissident minorities, or any other device by which the Russians can foment discontent within the established Governments outside the USSR.

He thus challenges the "peace feelers" from Moscow. He says the Soviet Union "completely distorted the meaning" bf U. S. Ambassador Smith's statement to Molotov and adds that the Russians seek to create the impression that we are making overtures for a bi-lateral agreement.

Desires for peace, he says, must not "lead us into ill-advised and "trust und to lead us into ill-advised and "trust und cations which hazard the future of this country which hazard the future of this country which hazard the future of this country will lead to the firm country where he was to a sound basis for peace. I am absolutely certain that only such a firm and determined course can save the situation for the democracies."
