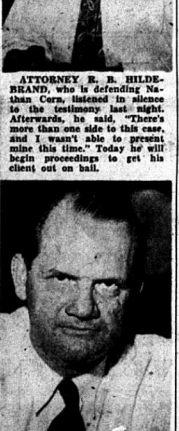

Council Of Berlin Says City Faces Starvation
