

PARIS —(AP)— Premier Georges Bidault won a vote of confidence from the National Assembly today. The modified count was 392 to 306.

The vote was on the question of whether to raise the tax on industrial production from 12.5 per cent to 13.5 per cent. The Cabinet had urged this. Communists and followers of Gen. Charles de Gaulle voted against it.

The vote was expected to raise about \$1,000,000,000 francs (\$128,000,000) in additional revenue to meet the cutbacks in Bidault's 1950 budget, calling for expenditures of about 2,257,000,000 francs (\$284,000,000).

Parliament already has agreed in principle to this budget, but is hailing at raising the revenue to meet it.
