

Senate Votes on Minimum Foundation Program

2nd Serious Reversal For School Plan

Vote Against Bill By 32-13 Margin

RALEIGH — (AP)—Legislative forces fighting for a "minimum foundation" program to support the public schools met another serious reversal in the General Assembly today.

The Senate, by a vote of 22 to 11, upheld action of its Education Committee yesterday in giving the House a bill embodying the Minimum Foundation program.

After the vote rejecting the minority report, the Senate applied the legislative "climber" to the motion of Sen. O. L. Richardson of Union. This would make it necessary to obtain a two-thirds vote before the measure could be considered further.

Under the Foundation proposal, the State would assume 85 per cent of school costs and the counties would raise the remaining 15 per cent from local property taxes.

Filibuster Battle

Roll Call Demanded

WASHINGTON — (AP)—Democratic Leader Lucas of Illinois, whipped in the fight over changing the Senate's rules, baited today to get all Southern Democrats to vote on the floor.

"We are going to demand a record vote (roll call) on every Senate bill," Democratic Leader Lucas of Illinois said. "We have to find out just who has surrendered."

His view is that Republicans "sold out" on the anti-filibuster issue and made a deal with Southern Democrats opposed to curbing the right of unlimited debate.

Republicans who worked out a "compromise" with Democratic anti-filibuster viewpoint and a practical solution for ending a situation which had the Senate tied in knots for fifteen days.

The plan would let the affirmative vote of 64 of the 96 Senators end debate on most bills. It would not apply to any new proposals to change Senate rules.

At that hour, bipartisan circulation of the compromise announced they had the pledges of 52 members to support it and it alone. The 52 included 30 Democrats and 22 Republicans.

At a signal, Senator John Johnson (D-SC) ended a four hour and 20 minute speech. He was the fourth Southern filibuster to hold the floor since the controversy began last month.

Johnston sat down. The filibuster was over. The roll call was demanded by a quorum call.
