## Landlords' Income Tax Rents Ordered

WASHINGTON (AP)—Housing expediter T. H. Woods today ordered a survey of landlord incomes. The findings will determine what rent increases are to be granted under the new control law.

Announcing the order in a statement, Woods declared the fifteen-month extension is "a considerable strengthening" of the previous law and does not mean a general rent increase for all tenants.

The new law does require that rent ceilings allow for a "fair operating income." The survey is to obtain information for carrying out that part of the law.

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Truman declared today that he still wants his anti-inflation program and higher taxes. It speaks of the recent drop in prices as only a temporary let up in inflation pressure.
