#### OBSTACLE REMOVED

MOST Americans, we believe, will get a hitto dut of the news that the two houses of Congress have settled their dufferences and adopted a workable law authorizing the President to carry out the recommendations of the Hoover Commis-

sion.

Now, after all these weeks of delay, we are past the first major stumbling block. Under the law as finally adopted, the President has all the authority he needs to undertake this important assignment; yet the perogatives of the Congress are amply protected.

The Senate measure exempted no agencies, and provided that a majority of the members voting in both houses would be necessary to block a reorganization pro-pose!

posal. The compromise, approved by both houses yesterday, is about what President Truman and Mr. Hoover had asked. It exempts no agencies, and requires that a majority of the shole membership of either house is necessary. That will make it

much harder for pressure groups and lob-byists to persuade Congress to kill any re-organization plan. organization plan.
The initiative is now the Président's.
Under the law, no reorganization bill can
become effective until it has stayed before
Congress 60 day's. Even if some of the

The measure passed by the House is somewhat better. But Sen. McCarran does not like the House measure. He stands staunchly behind the old, restrictive Wiley-Reveromb anti-DP law. He was so much sgainst liberalization of the law that he appointed himself chairman of the inmi-gration subcommittee of the Judiciary group for the sole purpose of blocking a better deal for the displaced persons of Europe.

# PROFIT AND PUBLIC SERVICE

A BOOK publishing firm has sold more books in the past ten years than the combined total of all best sellers since 1880. This firm has sold 280 million books. Some of them—35 per cent—were mysteries and Westerns. Some of the others were light romance and comedy.

But many of them were social, economic, religious, political and inapiration books. Some were histories, reference books, poet-fy books.

A lot of people have learned a lot of things in the past ten years because of this book publishing firm: Pocket Books, Inc. Ten years ago — June 19, 1839 — this company began distribution. Its first book was "The Good Earth." by Pearl Buck. Since then it has published 600 titles. This tremendous business success came because the books sold for 25 cents.

lishers know now that there is a market for books, if they are offered at a reason-able price. And the public, long stumped by \$3 and \$4 prices, is learning to read and like it.

The effect of low priced "pocket books"— the term has come to cover the entire field —can't be charted. A graph showing how much more knowledge the 1949 population of this nation has over 1939 would be diffi-cult, if not impossible, to draw.
