Coplon Says Defense Hampered

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Truman complained in near-hysterical tones today that the Government is not giving him full freedom to defend himself against espionage charges.

"I feel that I'm kept in a straitjacket," he shouted at John M. Kelley, Jr., Government prosecutor.

"I would like for the jury to see the kind of work I did," Mr. Coplon said.

"The Government needs no evidence to show that you are a spy," Mr. Coplon said.

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Reds Lose Heavily In Holland Voting

AMSTERDAM—(AP)—Dutch Communists lost heavily in the right wing in yesterday's municipal elections throughout The Netherlands.

The Communists lost almost half of their seats in municipal councils, holding only 11 as compared with 61 seats in 1946.

Peach Growers Attack Crop Service
