Medlin was arrested at 10 o'clock today by Police De-tectives Carl Holliman and Homer Gardner, assisted by four other plainclothesmen. The Negro also confessed the throat-slicing of Wilford Randleman, presently employed as butler at the two-story Anderson home, 1128 Queens Road.
