Many Truman Proposals Face Defeat In Congress U. S. WON'T INTERVENE TO SAVE FORMOSA

Tax Boost Least Likely To Succeed

Civil Rights Also Appear Doomed

WASHINGTON—(AP)—The conciliatory tone of President Truman's State of the Union message with a virtual promise today of quick death for at least half a dozen of his proposals.

In a surprising swing toward budget cuts, the most fiscally minded lawmakers lighted on Mr. Truman's request for a "moderate tax." They had already shoveted it to the head of the list marked for rejection in this session.

Out of a cascade of reaction to the President's message yesterday came clear indications that important members of both parties will not consider tax legislation only if drastic economy moves fail—and then reluctantly.

Similarly, the Senate leaders in a position to act said in about as many words that the President's appeals for controls, minimum wage, draft, Taft-Hartley repeal, the Brannan farm plan, medical insurance and the St. Lawrence project will go on the shelf for this session.

GREEN LIGHT FOR 3

There was an apparently clear-cut (1) expansion of direct deposit of government benefits and (2) continuation — on a reduced scale — of economic and military aid to non-Communist countries.

The list of certainties ended.

Lawmakers ranged in the doubtful category the Presidential proposals for middle-income housing aid, continuation of rent control, extension of limited personal admissions, aid to education and the "modest" four-point program for the world's poor for the world's poorest areas.

They gave even less chance of passage to an international currency agreement and the President's civil rights program.

In his mildly-phrased message, the President had asked for "more," but had asked for action only on things he has talked about before.

Democrats met this immediately with a scorching statement signed by 110 House GOP members accusing the President of "betraying" him to the eventual dismantling of America and the elimination of the traditional American way of life.

Senator Taft of Ohio, who heads the Senate GOP Policy Committee, and Senator Goldwater, who headed a minority group, responded with a mindless bit of Byron's quotation:

"The mild-mannered man that ever scuttled a ship or cut a trout."

Taft said Mr. Truman was inconsistent in his stand on the same time advocating "measures which would destroy freedom—special privilege to the rich" and "the right to deny medical care and taxes."

"The President's program was fathering 'hand-out' programs which will add ten or twelve million to the budget deficit."

DEFENSE AWAITED

The budget, to be sent to Congress Monday, promises to be a fiscal disaster. The economy was expected to be keeping up revenue in California.

Mr. Truman's budget, (D-Tex) told reporters yesterday that the new budget will call for "a little more than \$40 billion" in revenues, \$10,000,000 shorted off foreign and defense outlays, but including a \$1,200,000 increase in domestic spending.

This increase would be a sure target for Congressional money men.

Even Mr. Truman's appeal for a "moderate amount" of new taxes will not be enough to meet the needs of the public welfare super-

intendent.

A physician pleaded guilty yesterday to an indictment charging his first degree murder of an incurable cancer patient.
