The authorization move was made known at a news conference held by the joint chiefs of staff who have just returned from a 10-day tour of Pacific bases.

Sen. Johnson Says U.S. Lags In Guided Missiles

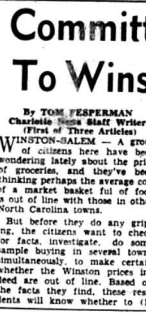

Seen As Step Toward Cure Doctors Isolate Cause Of Common Cold

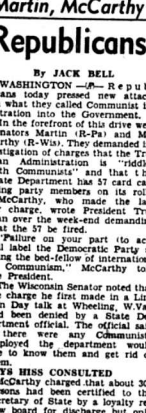
