Drive Against Crime, Gambling Gains Speed

Crackdown Tops Since Prohibition Many Government Agencies Involved

WASHINGTON—(AP)—A Senate investigation of crime and gambling appears to be snow-balling today into the biggest Government crackdown on the underworld since prohibition days.

With a full support of President Truman—reaffirmed at his news conference yesterday—a special Senate Committee moved toward a series of fact-breaking inquiries stretching all the way from New York and Florida to California.
