TRUMAN ORDERS U.S. SHIPS, PLANES TO AID SOUTH KOREA

Congressmen Back Truman Korean Move

Other Nations To Be Asked To Help

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senator Lucas of Illinois, the Democratic leader, said today negotiations are underway to get other nations to join the United States in armed support of South Korean forces.

Lucas made this statement to the Senate after congressional leaders of both parties swung quickly behind President Truman's action in drawing a line against Communist advances in the far Pacific and ordering support of the South Koreans.

While Mr. Truman made no concerted effort with other non-Communist nations, Lucas said negotiations to that end are in progress.

In Canberra, Australian Prime Minister Robert G. Menzies announced today that his government was being dispatched to Singapore because of the situation in Korea.

Lucas was one of those who attended a White House conference of Congressional leaders here today to discuss the new policy decision.

Senator Lodge (R-Mass.) told reporters he is prepared to go even farther — to use American land forces that become necessary to throw the Communists back of the 38th parallel, the border from which they attacked.

Lucas read Mr. Truman's policy statement to the Senate with the comment that it presents "a very serious situation."

Senator Millikin of Colorado, chairman of the conference of all Republican senators, agreed yesterday the United States should not allow the Koreans fighting to involve themselves in the President's move.

"The conference took its action," he said, "and I am sure the Congressmen on page 7-A."

WASHINGTON (AP)—A resolution asking that Lister Hill of Alabama be removed from the Senate was introduced today in the House by Representative Charles McNair of Indiana.

The McNair resolution, which passed by a vote of 237 to 191, asks that Hill be removed from the Senate because of his alleged involvement in the Korean situation.

McNair said that Hill had been involved in a scheme to raise money for the Korean war effort, and that this was in violation of the Espionage Act.

The resolution was introduced by McNair, who is a member of the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

Bombers Due To Go Into Action

U. S. Commander Reported Named

TOKYO Wednesday (AP)—Decision to send American-manned bombers to drive the invading Communists out of South Korea and appointment of an American general to command "joint defense operation" were reported early today.

This report was confirmed two and one-half hours later by announcement in Washington that President Truman had ordered American planes and warships to aid South Korea.
