THE DECISION of Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Jakob A. Malik to end the Russian boycott of the U. N. Security Council has stirred widespread and conflicting speculation.

THE HIGH COST OF SPEEDING

DO YOU KNOW that if you drive your car at the rate of 45 miles per hour, you may die to your destination quicker than you are not killed or seriously injured—but that it will cost you considerably more if you had driven at the rate of 40 or 45 MPH?

Obviously, the chances of serious accidents multiply with increased speed. At a speed of 35 miles an hour, the Council tests disclosed, 43 out of 1,000 drivers are injured in accidents. At 45 miles this figure

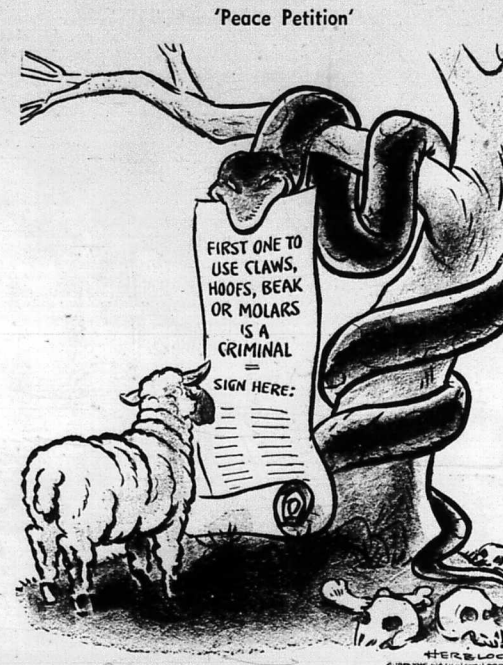
