or two cases, according to the Releigh
Neus & Observer, the callers managed to
falk with the doctor. In most cases, they
never got by the secretaries and office
stiendants, even though they emphasized
the emergency nature of the calls. There
was no way to relieve the fajured man's

pain, much less give him prompt medical

ention.

It is entirely probable that many of doctors were at lunch at that particular time. Doctors have to eat like everyone else. But certainly the incident calls for a size. But certainly the incident calls for a vigorous investigation by the Wake County Medical Society to see wherein that organ-ization has failed to provide prompt and immediate medical attention to suffering human beings.

We trust such an inquiry will be made.
And we suggest further—to the people of
Mecklenburg County as well as Wake
County—that the incident points up the
need for a different system of emergency
ambulance service. In many of the larger ambulance service. In many of the larger cities, ambulances are operated by hos-pitals. Resident physicians or interns ride the ambulances and hence are able to render appedy medical attention at the scene of an accident, and on the way to the hospital. The operation of ambulances is not properly a function of private mortuaries that at best can merely dis-patch drivers who are trained in elemen-tary first all etechnique.
