Yanks Regain Some Ground Lost To Red Foe

Enemy Now Identified As Chinese Marine Push On Power Dam Stalled

SEOUL —(AP)— American troops in northwest Korea this afternoon recovered a half-mile of ground lost to a morning Communist attack and fought bitterly for no gain in the northeast against an enemy newly identified by General MacArthur as Chinese Reds.

Elements of two U. S. divisions leading the landward area north of the Chongchon River near Kosen's west coast recovered the six-mile strip to the Reds six miles north of Anju.

They had been shoved back an estimated half-mile by two battalions of Communists who attacked in darkness at 4:30 A. M. but finally held at 7 A. M.
